
### **Customs Pillars and Outcomes**

- Establish practices using identified resources that support your health, safety, and wellbeing
- Describe how privilege shapes the way that members of the Haverford community interact
- Respectfully and responsibly engage in on- and off-campus community spaces
- Select from multiple modalities to respectfully and productively engage with different perspectives

#### **Honor Code in Action**

#### **Holistic Student Wellbeing**

- Learn about resources and practices that promote wellness
- Recognize the ways care and concern are expressed among students
- Make connections with faculty, staff, and student leaders who care about your success and wellbeing



#### **Equity + Inclusion:**

- Recognize and reflect upon how privilege and oppression can structure the college experience
- Learn about histories of exclusion and marginalization at Haverford and beyond, as well as the work of individuals and movements to make colleges more inclusive and accessible
- Explore concrete ways the Haverford community can and does work toward equity and inclusion



#### **Ethical Community Engagement**

- Learn which communities exist on and off campus
- Participate in meaningful shared experiences in vibrant community spaces
- Practice social responsibility and accountability when engaging with others



#### **Dialogue Across Perspectives**

- Learn to practice radical listening to perspectives that may differ from your own
- Prepare to engage in dialogue, circles, confrontations, and the respectful exchange of ideas in ways that accord with college community norms and expectations
- Practice individual and collective accountability and preserve relationships while allowing differences to emerge through dialogue
